Part II: YOUR HIGH HOLIDAY PREFERENCES

High Holiday Offerings

OKC provides a variety of offerings during the high holidays. **On both *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*, two main services are available to everyone:**

1. Conservative services, led by OKC Rabbi Lyle Fishman and guest Cantor Joel Lichterman, are offered in the **Mayer & Ethel Lerner Sanctuary**. Tickets for these services are issued on a reserved-seat basis.
2. Conservative services, led by visiting Rabbi Micha'el Rosenberg and Neal Meiselman, are offered downstairs in the **Murray & Nettie Kaye Social Hall**. Please be aware that seating in this service is OPEN; there are no assigned seats, but arrangements CAN be made for any special needs upon request!

OKC also offers a variety of additional **family-oriented and youth services and activities**. This programming is generally organized to accommodate three main age groups: (A) under 18 months, (B) ages 18 months through third grade; and (C) fourth grade through seventh grade. These offerings include:

1. **Family Service**. For families with children A and/or B above, a one-hour Family service is offered from 9:15-10:15 AM on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah* and on *Yom Kippur*. This service proves to be popular; be sure to reserve your seats early!
2. **Babysitting**. In addition, for families with children in group A and/or B above, babysitting services will be offered by advance request at specific times: on the second day of *Rosh Hashanah*, from 9:30 – 10:30 AM, and both evenings of *Yom Kippur*, from the start of *Minchah* until the adult services (*Kol Nidreil/Neilah*) conclude.
3. **Children's Programming**. For children in groups B and/or C above, several age-appropriate services are offered from 10:30 AM – 1 PM (if in group B) or from 11:15 AM -12:30 PM (if in Group C) on both days of *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*.

****IMPORTANT:** Youth in Grades 4 - 7 are expected to participate in the main services until 11:15 AM (as there are no Children's services for that age range until that time). Families are therefore expected to order seats for them above AND further below as needed (the \$80 fee includes both).

High Holiday Seat Pricing

Providing this array of offerings requires additional resources from clergy and staff. Since membership dues do not cover the expenses required to provide High Holiday programming, OKC has designed an a la carte fee structure for its High Holiday offerings. OKC also feels that this fee structure should not be prohibitive for anyone interested in joining for High Holidays, and encourages questions about financial arrangements to be directed to Jerry Kiewe, OKC Executive Director, at JKiewe@ohrkodesh.org

 - For children in 4th grade and older who have purchased seats in one of the regular services, there is no additional charge.
 - For children 8 months through 3rd grade, there is a fee of \$60/family to participate in the Family Service only. An additional \$20 is requested to reserve a seat for the child in the Main Sanctuary or Social Hall.

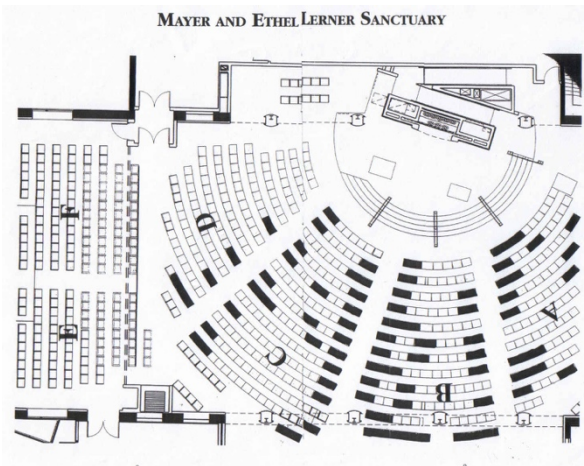
